<u>Alameda County Historical Society Quarterly</u>, October 2012, Dennis Evaonsky writes, "Masterpiece graces Tilden Park". The carousel in Tilden Park was built by the Herschell-Spillman Company. Rather than bolt the horses to the floor, they were suspended from above allowing their riders to swing in and out as the carousel turned.

Mission Peak Reporter, October-December 2012, has a story entitled, "The Columbian Exposition, Chicago 1893". Milicent Shinn was invited to the 1893 Chicago World's fair to make her presentation on her research on child development. The most popular item at the fair was the Ferris Wheel. George Ferris convinced people that this wheel would favorably compare to the Eiffel Tower from the 1889 Paris Exposition and would make money for the fair.

<u>Union City Historical Museum</u>, November 2012, Anthony Gualco writes about John M. Horner's successful farming near Mission san Jose in the 1850's and Henry C. Smith, who opened a trading post at the Mission and supplied miners going through the Mission Pass on their way to the gold fields.


